



Questions & Answers about Berridge Metal Roofing for Your New Home:

What about appearance? I don't want a "corrugated tin" roof on my new home!

Berridge has the look that fits the architectural design of your new home: Victorian Shingles for an authentic "turn of the century" look, or Tee-Panel Standing Seam panels which provide the classic look of clean, thin lines. We have other products which offer the appearance of curved barrel vaults, shake shingle, horizontal Bermuda tiles, Spanish barrel tiles and S-Tile patterns.

What about color and durability? I want my roof color to coordinate with my home's exterior colors, but I'm concerned about how long the colors will retain their original appearance.

Berridge Residential Metal Roofing Products are available in a wide palette of colors to coordinate with other exterior building materials on your new home. We use only premium Kynar 500 / Hylar 5000 color finishes which provide the maximum in color retention and durability.

I live in a fire-prone area and need a "Class A" Rated Roof; How does a Berridge Metal Roof compare to other products such as aluminum or concrete tiles?

Because we use only 24-gage high-strength steel, all Berridge Metal Roofs are Class-A rated. Softer materials such as aluminum have a lower melting point and also lack the tensile strength and durability you require.

What about hurricane-force winds? I really need a strong roof that won't blow away with the first strong wind!

Berridge Standing Seam and other roof systems have passed stringent Dade County testing requirements. Most all of our metal roof systems also carry the nationally Underwriter's Laboratory UL90 wind uplift rating, recognized by insurance firms, architect's and designers.

Aren't metal roofs noisy? I want peace and quiet!

The underlayment, sub-structure, insulation and attic airspace all act together to deaden outside sounds and give you the same peace and quiet as other roof coverings.

How does the cost of a metal roof compare with asphalt composition and other type roof coverings?

While the initial in-place cost of a metal roof may be substantially higher (from 3.5 to 5 times the cost of composition shingles) than other types of roofs, they will actually save you money over the life of your home, since a Berridge Metal Roof will last forty years or more. With other roofing materials,

you would incur removal and replacement costs every ten to fifteen years.
